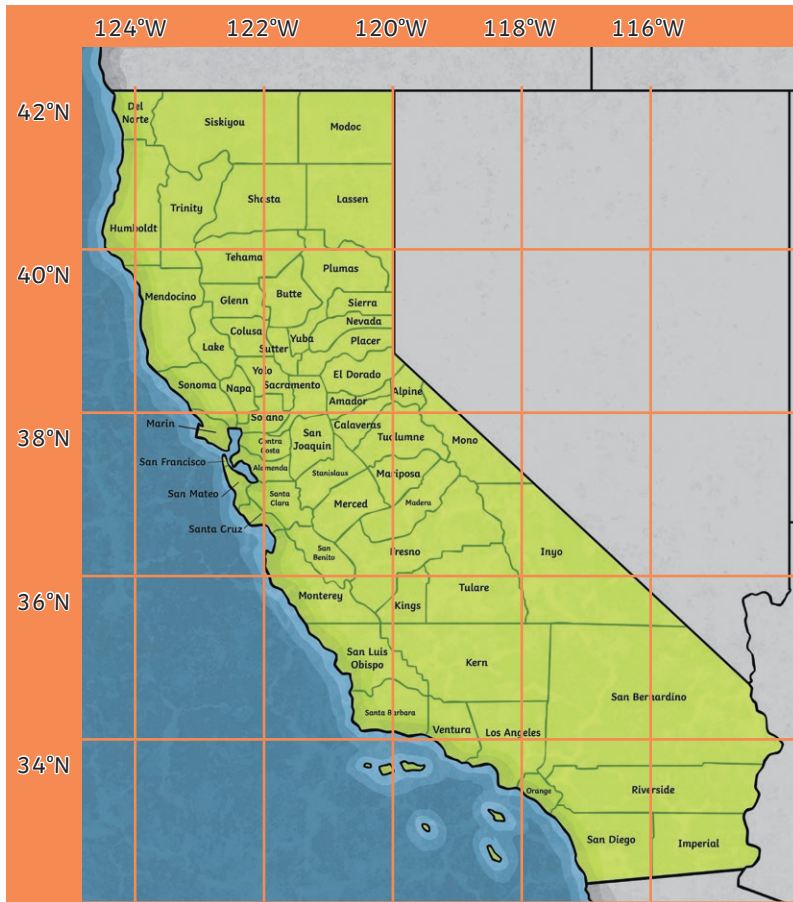


California Latitude and Longitude
